General Dress and Grooming

Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean and neat.

1. No piercings for males. Two ear-piercings allowed for females.
2. No unnatural hair colors.
3. No visible permanent tattoos.
4. Clothing, including outerwear, or jewelry with any writing, picture or emblems that are lewd, offensive, vulgar or obscene; advertises tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs or any other substance prohibited under FNCF (Legal)

Dress and Grooming

Shirts/Blouses/Outerwear

1. Any solid color polo is required, when not wearing CSCISD spirit t-shirts and include college/university t-shirts on Wednesdays
2. All Shirts must have sleeves, short or long, and be buttoned.
3. No zippers allowed on shirts/blouses
4. Any solid color applies to optional undershirt for boys and girls including turtlenecks.
5. Sweatshirts with a hood “hoodies” may be worn – provided they are school compliant.

Pants, Shorts, Capris

1. Jeans may be worn by all students grades PreK – 12, provided that they do not have any holes, shreds or frays. Leggings are not allowed under jeans to cover holes.
2. Athletic shorts, sweatpants, wind-pants, drawstring pants and warm-ups are not allowed.
3. Oversized, and/or baggy-style pants/shorts/capris are not allowed.
4. Shorts length must be no more than 1” above the knee.

Skirts/Skorts/Jumpers

Color: (solid, single colors)

Skirts, skorts, and Jumpers length must be no more than 1” above the knee.

1. Skirts may have a slit/pleat which opens no higher than 1” above the knee
2. Dress shirts, blouses, or turtleneck can be worn

Shoes

All types of “flip-flops” are not allowed. (Decorated or non-decorated) Sandals must have an ankle strap.

NON-UNIFORM DAYS

Administration shall have authority to waive the wearing of dress for certain days due to special events or special activities. Students who choose not to participate in the special days are expected to wear dress.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR DRESS CODE

The principal, in cooperation with the sponsor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity. Students who violate dress and grooming standards established for such an activity may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the principal or sponsor, and may be subject to other disciplinary action, as specified in the Student Code of Conduct. COMPLIANCE

If a student attends schools in violation of dress, disciplinary steps as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct and Student handbook will be taken.

FINAL AUTHORITY

School administrators will have complete and final judgment on all matters concerning interpretation of the student dress. Matters concerning appearance and dress not specifically covered in FNCA (LOCAL) Policy shall be within the discretion of the administration.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

In case of severe financial hardship, parents may contact the office of the Federal Programs Director to request assistance when financially unable to purchase the dress clothing. Please note: having a child on the free/reduced lunch program does not automatically qualify the family for assistance.
